

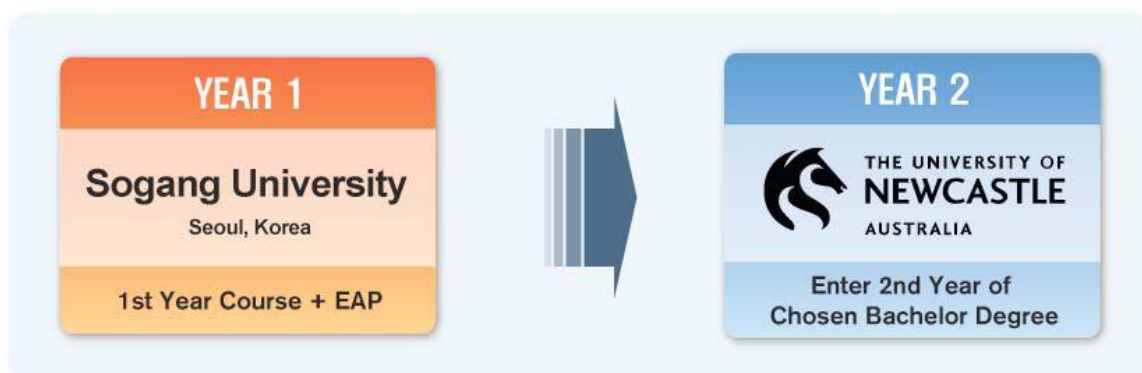
The University of Newcastle offers Korean students a pathway to University in Seoul

The University of Newcastle has joined with Sogang University and International Education Network (IEN) to deliver a high-quality Undergraduate articulation program in Seoul. With all classes taught on campus at Sogang University, this program offers students in Seoul the opportunity to complete 1 year of study as a pathway to entering 2nd year of the following programs at the University of Newcastle, Australia:

- Bachelor of Commerce (with majors in Accounting, Economics and Finance)
- Bachelor of Business (with majors in Human Resource Management, International Business, Management, Marketing, Supply Chain Management and Tourism)
- Bachelor of Information Technology (with majors in Business Information, Communications & Technology; Digital Media & Entertainment; and Software Development & Applications)
- Combined Degrees:
 - Bachelor of Commerce / Bachelor of Laws
 - Bachelor of Business / Bachelor of Commerce
 - Bachelor of Information Technology / Bachelor of Business

Beginning in 2005, the Undergraduate articulation program has grown over the years to become an extremely popular option for Korean students seeking an overseas study option. Offering students a pathway from the completion of their High School Certificate, this program is designed to enhance the students' academic and English language abilities through an innovative curriculum that combines a focus of Language training, academic theory and practical experience. The programs are taught by academics from overseas as well as academics from Sogang University.

Students in the program complete 1 year of study on the campus of Sogang University in Seoul, before moving into 2nd year of their chosen degree program in Newcastle. Students will choose to enrol in either the Information Technology stream or the Business stream and will study subjects that are identical to the 1st year curriculum of the University's own program.
