To be eligible to graduate make sure you have completed 320 units (10 units = 1 course unless otherwise specified) which meet the following criteria:

- ✓ Core courses (including Professional Placement) - 260 units.
- ✓ Compulsory courses (including Professional Placement) - 60 units.
- ✓ Students must only complete courses which count towards their program.
- ✓ Graded Honours and Special Education pathways are available only to those students who meet the eligibility requirements.
- ✓ For students who commence the program in Semester 2, in either the Special Education or Graded Honours pathway, the minimum duration to complete is 4.5 years, due to course structure and availability.
- ✓ The maximum time to complete this program is 10 years.
