To be eligible to graduate make sure you have completed 320 units (10 units = 1 course unless otherwise specified) which meet the following criteria:

- ✓ Core courses (including Professional Placement) - 180 units.
- ✓ Compulsory - 90 units (Ungraded Honours) or 100 units (Graded Honours).
- ✓ Minor courses - 40 units.
- ✓ Electives - 10 units (Ungraded Honours only). Visit the [Course Handbook](#) to see a list of available Electives.
- ✓ Students must not exceed 100 units at any level (1000, 2000, 3000, or 4000).
- ✓ Graded Honours is available only to those students who meet the eligibility requirements.
- ✓ The duration of this program is 4 years full time study (40 units per semester) or part time equivalent.
- ✓ The maximum time to complete this program is 10 years.

### **Transition/Course Replacements\***

**If you have not already completed the pre-2019 courses then you must complete the courses listed in the program plan above/detailed below.**

- ARBE1201 replaces ARBE1100: Communication in the Built Environment 1. If you have successfully completed ARBE1100, you do not need to complete ARBE1201.
- DESN1001 replaces ARBE1500: Introduction to Design Practice. If you have successfully completed ARBE1500, you do not need to complete DESN1001.
- DESN1002 replaces ARBE1501: Project Development. If you have successfully completed ARBE1501, you do not need to complete DESN1002.
- DESN2003 replaces ARBE2500: Furniture, Form and Function. If you have successfully completed ARBE2500, you do not need to complete DESN2003.
- DESN2004 replaces ARBE2505: Sustainable Design. If you have successfully completed ARBE2505, you do not need to complete DESN2004.
- EDUC3506 replaces ARBE3506: Design Development and Management. If you have successfully completed ARBE3506, you do not need to complete EDUC3506.
- EDUC3507 replaces ARBE3507: Project Design and Development. If you have successfully completed ARBE3507, you do not need to complete EDUC3507.
- ENGG1500 replaces ARBE3503: Form, Function and the Human Interface. If you have successfully completed ARBE3503, you do not need to complete ENGG1500.
