\* Depending on your chosen Major and Minor sequence, you may have the same compulsory courses in your Minor as your Major. If this is the case, you can take an Elective in this place.

To be eligible to graduate make sure you have completed 320 units (10 units = 1 course unless otherwise specified) which meet the following criteria:

- ✓ Core Courses (including Professional Placement) - 140 units.
- ✓ Major - 80 units. To meet the requirements of the major sequence please refer to the [Program Handbook](#) for the specific rules for each Major.
- ✓ Minor - 60 units. Students may elect to utilise 20 units of their elective to upgrade their minor to a major, in which case they must ensure that they follow Major program rules. Please note Chinese and Legal studies may only be undertaken as a Minor.
- ✓ Compulsory Courses - 30 units.
- ✓ Electives - 10 units.
- ✓ Students must not exceed 100 units at any level (1000, 2000, 3000 or 4000).
- ✓ Graded Honours is available only to those students who meet eligibility requirements. Students who plan to complete Graded Honours cannot complete a second Minor or Double Major.
- ✓ Students wishing to complete a Double Minor sequence, or Ungraded honours, please refer to the Bachelor of Teaching (Humanities) (Honours) Single Major Pathway Program Plan.
- ✓ Students wishing to complete a Double Major program sequence, please refer to the Bachelor of Teaching (Humanities) (Honours) Double Major Pathway Program Plan.
- ✓ The duration of this program is 4 years fulltime study (40 units per semester) or part time equivalent.
- ✓ The maximum time to complete this program is 10 years.

## Bachelor of Teaching (Humanities) (Honours) Major/Minor Sequences

A major or minor is an area of study that you wish to focus on in your program. A course will count towards your major or minor if it is listed as a compulsory or directed course under the relevant major in the [Program Handbook](#). You must complete **80 units in your Major**, and 60 units in your minor. To meet the requirements of the major sequence please refer to the handbook for the specific rules for each specialisation. A second minor of 40 units is also available for those completing the Ungraded Honours stream.

### Board of Studies Registration Requirements

Teacher	Registration requirements
English teacher	Students must enrol in at least 30 units of literature. Additional units may be taken in creative writing, film or other literature.
Drama teacher	Students must ensure course choices cover performance, production, theory and preferably Australian Drama.
Modern History teacher	Students must enrol in at least 10 units of Australian History courses.
Studies of Religion teacher	Students should enrol in no more than 20 units in any one religious tradition, and should not complete more than 10 units of AHIS courses (ancient religious history or traditions).
Legal Studies teacher	40 units of social science with 20 units above 1000 level, including Legal Studies. As Legal Studies is only offered as a minor, accreditation is only possible when completing Society and Culture Major.
