To be eligible to graduate make sure you have completed 120 units (10 units = 1 course unless otherwise specified) which meet the following criteria:

- ✓ Core Courses - 100 units.
- ✓ Directed Courses - 20 units.
- ✓ The recommended duration of this program is 5 trimesters (full time).
- ✓ All students should complete GSBS6001 in their first term of study
- ✓ GSBS6507 and GSBS6192 are capstone courses, and should be completed towards the end of the program.
- ✓ The maximum time to complete this program is 5 years
- ✓ Do you have qualifications or experience beyond the minimum entry requirements for a Masters Degree? If so, you may be able to complete your degree in [reduced time and at reduced cost](#).
