DESCRIPTION

The Avery Index to Architectural Periodicals indexes more than 2,000 periodicals published worldwide on archaeology, urban planning, interior design, and historic preservation, history of architecture, architectural design, landscape architecture, furniture and decoration, as well as architecture. The Avery Index to Architectural Periodicals has more than 229,000 records and is produced for RLG by the Getty Institute for the History of Art & the Humanities and Avery Architectural & Fine Arts Library, Columbia University.

COVERAGE

1930's – present (with selective coverage dating back to the 1860's)

Print copies from 1973-93 are located in the Auchmuty Library at RQ016.72 AVER

Updated daily.

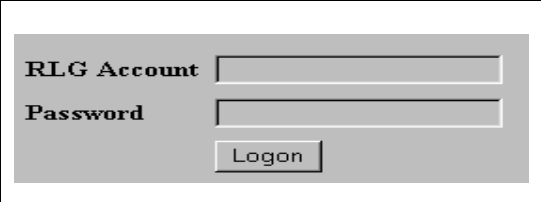

SEARCHING

Avery has 2 search modes which are Simple and Advanced

SIMPLE SEARCH

- To begin searching select *Simple Search* or *Advanced Search*
- Select either *keyword*, *author*, *title*, *subject*, *abstract*, *word* or *journal*
- Type in **your search terms** in the search box. For example, select *keyword* and type **verandah**
- Select *search*
- A list of records will appear sorted by date, author and title
- Select *Full display* or *Brief display*
- Mark the records you wish to see by clicking in the adjacent box
- Select *Send*

ADVANCED SEARCH

The Advanced Search screen offers more ways to search authors, titles, subjects, abstracts, journals and also offers Boolean searching:

- And (where both terms are present)
- Or (where either term is present)
- And Not (exclude second term)

TIPS

- Use the truncation symbol ? to find variants and plurals of a word
For example : theat? for both theater and theatre
- Omit the first word if it is an article (a, the, le)
- For a French or Italian word that might have an article such as d' or l' attached, search both with and without the article.
For example : d'azeglio and l'eglise
- Click Journal Titles for a complete list of the journals indexed in this database
- Use Author, Title, or Subject indexes with exact phrases
- Use Author Word, Title Word or Subject Word with distinctive words
- Use Keyword with distinctive words which must all come from one author's name, or one title, one subject heading, one abstract or one content note

LIMITING

If your search results have a large of records you can limit your search results by Date, Language, and Country of Publication.

DISPLAYING A SEARCH RESULT

- The **Headings** display includes one line for each heading with a count of the different records that use the heading. Headings are in alphabetical order.
- The **Records List** display includes one line for each item in the results and includes the title and year.
- The **Brief** display includes title, journal, publisher and links to summaries and abstracts.
- The **Full** display includes publishing details, multiple subject headings and added authors.
- The **Sort Order** allows the result sets of 250 or fewer records to be sorted by date and then title.

EXPORTING SEARCH RESULTS

You can send, save, or print Brief or Full displays of records by using the Export icon.

Go to the **OPTIONS** button in the left frame to set the choice of sending, saving, or printing your records and the format you want.

You can change your export method at any time by returning to Options.

50 records can be exported at one time.

HELP

Select *Help* to find additional information about searching, displaying search results and using the notebook.

EXIT

Remember to **EXIT** when you have finished searching.
