

The Gender Justice Hub bridges higher education, policy, student voice, and specialists in the domestic, family and sexual violence sector in our region to generate research, programs and collective advocacy to address gender-based violence. It has emerged in direct response to research with student victim-survivors who identified the need for greater awareness for, and supports responding to, the impact of gender-based violence, experienced across the life-course, on higher education access and participation. Gender-based violence is a global crisis and is experienced at critically high-levels in our region.
