To be eligible to graduate make sure you have completed 80 units (10 units = 1 course unless otherwise specified) which meet the following criteria:

- ✓ Core courses – 30 units
- ✓ Specialisation Compulsory &/or Directed courses – 50 units
- ✓ Program is offered by distance learning online with compulsory attendance at a three-day residential workshop
- ✓ The maximum time to complete this program is 4 years
- ✓ The above enrolment pattern is a recommended pattern only. Students who are working whilst studying would typically complete 10-20 units per term
