

Health and wellbeing support

Student Living has a highly skilled team dedicated to ensuring our residents have a safe, rewarding and enjoyable residential experience, including a registered Mental Health Clinician to support the wellbeing of everyone living on campus.

Student Living provides a number of rooms that cater to accessibility needs of residents. Our team can work with you to discuss your options.

Sustainability

Sustainability is a key priority here at the University of Newcastle. Here are a few of the ways we are reducing our environmental impact:

- Gas boosted solar hot water, LED lighting and motion sensors have been installed across all of our tower residences
- · 2 hour timers are installed on all air conditioners
- Drought proof native plants are used throughout the precinct to limit watering requirements
- Soft plastic and coffee cup recycling at West Residence and clothing donation bins at South Residence

The added extras

Living on campus is more than just a room, there are so many inclusions you might not have thought about that are packaged into your weekly room fees. Here are just some of the added extras:

- **Utilities included** think: water, electricity and internet, costs that you don't have to add to your budget.
- **Gym membership** activate your Student Living membership with NUsport to enjoy all the benefits of a healthy lifestyle including access to the gym floor, group classes and heated indoor swimming pool.
- **24/7 security** assistance with first aid, after dark safe walk service and foot patrols to ensure the safety of the precinct.
- Free campus transport shuttle bus around Callaghan campus and into Newcastle CBD and City campus with stops at local shopping centres.

- Residential Mentors peers that can support you during your time here
 with information on how to get around the city, which building your class
 is in, managing housemate disagreements and building connections with
 fellow residents through regular events.



Safety and security

Your safety is our number one priority. At Student Living, our residents are supported by 24/7 Campus Security services. This includes dedicated After-Hours Duty Officers (AHDOs), CCTV cameras, key and swipe card access into residences and rooms, and an on-call University security shuttle to get you around campus after dark.

After-Hours Duty Officers

Our After-Hours Duty Officers (AHDOs) provide after-hours support to residents, focusing on student safety and security, engaging with residents and maintaining the Student Living community standards.

Together with the Student Living and Campus Security teams, the AHDOs work to provide a safe and inclusive environment and ensure support for all residents.

24/7 Campus Security

The University provides trained security officers to help ensure you and your property are safe on campus. These officers are here 24/7, 365 days a year.

Services provided by the Campus Security team include first aid and emergency response, vehicle and foot patrols, CCTV monitoring, safe walk service and operation of the Callaghan Campus Security Shuttle service.



Leadership

As a resident you can apply for paid and volunteer roles as leaders during your time on campus.

These opportunities enhance your personal and professional development and help create life-ready graduates, ready to make meaningful contributions to our global community.

The residential leadership team is made up of our Residential Mentors (RMs) and Residential Associations. Our leaders work closely with Student Living to build an inclusive and respectful community, leading by example.

Strong, supportive and meaningful relationships are an important part of this community. Your RMs and Associations are there to help you connect with other residents, have an amazing residential experience and build the lifelong friendships that are unique to on-campus living.

Residential Mentors (RMs)

Your RM is your main contact for questions, support, and guidance, whether it's homesickness or finding your student card.

RMs are extensively trained in wellbeing, mental health, consent, inclusivity, and drug and alcohol education. They also organize engaging activities for students on your floor or block, so be sure to ask about upcoming events.

Residential Associations

Your Residential Association is comprised of students voted into this leadership role by their communities. Their purpose is to build a wider sense of belonging and community by organising events such as commencement, formal dinners, sport competitions and opportunities to get involved with charities to help you contribute to your community.

Callaghan - Where can I live? Barahineban

Built around a central courtyard and named for the Awabakal word meaning 'a bright place to live', Barahineban offers a unique residential experience.

Offering 96 self-contained, self-catered studio apartments available in two bed configurations, 2 x king single for friends or king for singles or couples, Barahineban is a great place to live.

Residents living at Barahineban, known fondly as 'Bara', have access to a large barbecue area, a study room and a centrally located common room that features a widescreen television, pool table and a small kitchenette.

Barahineban is the perfect place for students seeking a balanced academic and social environment while maintaining privacy and an independent lifestyle.





Edwards Hall - Main Hall

Edwards Hall – affectionately known as 'Teds' – was the first on-campus student accommodation residence at the University and was named after George Alfred Edwards, the University's first Deputy Chancellor. As the oldest residence, Edwards Hall is known for its proud traditions and spirited residential community.

Home to almost 300 residents each year across the dormitory-style Main Hall residence, Edwards Hall Main Hall is all about building strong connections and friendships.

Residents of Edwards Hall, Main Hall can enjoy three common rooms with lounges, televisions and a variety of entertainment equipment, multiple barbecue areas and a large outdoor swimming pool. With so many students living in close proximity, Edwards Hall is more than a place to live - it's a lively community that builds your confidence and social skills as you strive for academic success.

















Single room/shared bathroom/ 7 dinners/S/KS bed (10m²)*

Edwards Hall - Self Catered

Edwards Hall 'Selfies' is the self-catered, shared apartment-style accommodation of Edwards Hall. If you're looking to be part of the Teds community but prefer the flexibility of being able to prepare your own meals and live with a smaller group of students, this might be the option for you.

Each self-contained apartment houses up to five residents in individual bedrooms who share kitchen, bathroom, living and dining spaces. While Selfies, as the name suggests, is self-catered, you're still able to opt into a meal plan or stop by the Dining Hall for a casual meal with your friends whenever you like.

Evatt House

Evatt House is more than just a place to live while you study. Named after The Hon Elizabeth Evatt AC, the first Chief Justice of the Australian Family Court and first woman to preside in the Australian Federal Court, Evatt House is about pride, enthusiasm and seizing the day.



Blue Gum House

Divided into four wings with units of six or seven bedrooms in each wing, Blue Gum House is a home away from home to 26 residents. With kitchen, dining and lounge facilities open to all members of the wing, the common areas are a hub of activity. Blue Gum House is completely self-catered so our residents have the opportunity to cultivate their cooking skills in a fully equipped kitchen.

Residents have an impressive shared courtyard for social activities with wheelchair access, laundry facilities and a large barbecue area.



Short Stays - Where can I live? Nihon University Newcastle Campus

Nihon University Newcastle Campus offers short-term accommodation in the heart of Newcastle CBD for students studying at the University of Newcastle.

The accommodation offering provides single bedrooms with shared bathroom, kitchen and laundry facilities on gendered floors, along with common spaces for studying and socialising. The campus is a dry campus and Security is present in the facility 24/7, with key and swipe card access into the building and rooms, plus CCTV cameras throughout to ensure safety of all residents.

You will be on the doorstep of a bustling city, with exciting and engaging attractions accessible during the day and night. Within walking distance, you will find beaches, parks, restaurants, supermarkets, shopping boutiques, access to public transport, and the NUspace campus. Plus the University's free shuttle bus from NUspace connects you to the Callaghan campus.

Nihon University Newcastle Campus is perfect for students looking for a short-term accommodation contract while familiarising themselves with Newcastle, for those studying at NUspace, here for a specific short course or needing a home base while looking for something in the private rental market, or for those just wanting to be close by to the Honeysuckle area!







A free city shuttle runs between Callaghan and NUspace every 30 minutes during semester.




On weekdays during semester, a free shuttle also operates around Callaghan campus, including Warabrook train station. This shuttle is on-call until midnight.




There are approximately 700 car spaces available exclusively to residents as long as you have a Residential Parking Permit.

Getting around Ourimbah campus



Train access is available to Ourimbah campus residents via Ourimbah station.



The Ourimbah Campus Security shuttle departs from the bus stop on Loop Road but will come to your location on request. The service also includes drop off and pick up to Ourimbah Railway Station by request.



Ourimbah residents have access to a free and exclusive car park that is adjacent to Blue Gum House. When checking in, residents will need to apply online for a parking permit.
