This guide is intended for University of Newcastle staff members to use in the context of their employment only and provides general advice. University staff should contact the Copyright Advisor if they have specific questions or concerns.

Journal articles

Is the journal covered by a UON Read & Publish agreement?

NO

Is the journal <u>fully open access</u>?

The publisher will make the article open access via the journal website.

YES

If an Article Processing Charge (APC) is required, check the criteria for access to the APC Fund for high quality journals.

Does the *corresponding* author have a UON email address?

YES 4

When the corresponding author logs into the publisher's system to manage their accepted submission, they should see advice that the article is eligible for open access without charge because of a UON agreement with the publisher.

Important: Select (or accept) the 'Open access at no additional charge' option.

You will be provided with options for a Creative Commons licence – choose the licence that will work best for you.

You can usually make the author accepted manuscript (post-print) version open access, free of charge via NOVA.

IMPORTANT

Use your UON email and affiliation when you submit your article.

Some Read & Publish agreements have an annual limit. If the cap has been reached when your article is accepted, it will be published under the traditional subscription model. You can usually still make your author accepted manuscript (post-print) version open access via NOVA.

Scholarly books

OA Book Publishers Many traditional book publishers now have OA book programs. Fees generally apply (authors can use grant funding).

The <u>Directory of Open Access Books</u>, a catalogue of >52k open scholarly books, has a list of OA book publishers. Open Book Publishers is a scholar-led, non-profit (free-for-authors) publisher of books in HASS disciplines.

Pressbooks

UON researchers can create and publish OA textbooks using <u>Pressbooks</u>, UON's open textbook platform. For more

information on Open Educational Resources, see our OER quide.

NOVA

You may be able to make the accepted manuscript of a chapter OA via NOVA, depending on the publishing agreement.

Conference contributions

OA Proceedings In some cases, the full proceedings are made OA via the conference website after the conference.

NOVA You may be able to make the version of record (publisher PDF) or accepted manuscript of papers OA via NOVA.

Posters Authors generally retain copyright in their posters. This means that you can make them OA via NOVA.

Non-Traditional Research Outputs (NTROs)

Reports Provided a research report is not confidential, you may be able to make it OA via NOVA (or provide a link to promote it).

NOVA You may be able to make a copy or representation of your NTRO available via NOVA (or provide a link to promote it).
