- Core courses – 220 units  
Please note you're not able to study two studio courses concurrently (ie ARBE1222 Architecture Studio 1 and ARBE2220 Architecture Studio 3).
- Electives – 20 units, which must be **2000 level** or higher  
Students can choose from any **unrestricted** course taught at the University

The School of Architecture and Built Environment offers a range of flexible and intensive activities that can count as electives, run under one of the following course codes/names:

These activities are scheduled to run outside of the semester dates so as to allow you to attend all the classes of your other courses.

Please **contact** the School of Architecture and Built Environment for further information as these activities have limited availability and therefore have a ballot and selection process to go through.

- Students must not exceed 100 units at 1000 level and at least 40 units must be taken at each level from the 2000 level and above in this program. Note that electives **MUST** be 2000 level or higher
- The duration of this program is 3 year full-time (40 units per semester) or part-time equivalent
- The maximum time to complete this program is 8 years
