- ✓ Core Courses - 30 units
- ✓ Directed Courses - 50 units (30 units of face to face courses as specified in the enrolment guide above)
- ✓ Students can only complete up to 20 units of online courses.
- ✓ The approximate duration of this program is 1 year full time study.
- ✓ The intake for this program for on-campus international students is Trimester 1, 2 and 3.
- ✓ The above enrolment pattern complies with the conditions of international student visas. Failing to follow this enrolment advice may result in international students not being able to graduate within the period of their Confirmation of Enrolment. The above enrolment guide is the recommended pattern for international on-campus students only.
- ✓ The maximum time to complete this program is 4 years
