What kind of changes have been made to this program?

The Bachelor of Exercise and Sport Science program is being relocated from Ourimbah to the Callaghan Campus over a 5 year period. All students currently enrolled in this program at Ourimbah will be able to continue their studies, however this may involve some variation to your future enrolment.

Ourimbah Teach-Out Arrangements

* 'Teach-Out' refers to the phased discontinuation of courses and/or programs.

All students who are currently enrolled at the Ourimbah campus will have the opportunity to complete their studies at this campus through a phased teach-out of core courses. This will however involve ensuring that you are planning to enrol in line with the below phased teach-out arrangements for core EXSS courses.

1000 level (First Level) Core Courses	1000-level courses will be offered at Ourimbah for the final time in 2024
2000 Level (Second Level) Core Courses	2000-level courses will be offered at Ourimbah for the final time across 2025/2026 <i>Specific course breakdown TBA</i>
3000 Level (Third Level) Core Courses	3000-level courses will be offered at Ourimbah for the final time across 2026/2027 <i>Specific course breakdown TBA</i>

To ensure you are able to complete all of your remaining studies at Ourimbah, please complete the remaining courses within this schedule. Once further information is available regarding the specific course offerings for 2025 onwards, this document will be updated. Please ensure you redownload this document prior to enrolling beyond 2024.

Please note: That you will be able to elect to enrol in courses at the Callaghan campus instead of Ourimbah if you wish. First year courses will be offered at Callaghan for the first time from 2024. Electives can be undertaken at either the Callaghan or Ourimbah campus.

Frequently Asked Questions

Will all EXSS Courses be available at Callaghan from 2024?

Only first year core courses within the Bachelor of Exercise and Sport Science program will be offered for the first time at the Callaghan campus in 2024. Courses will be progressively rolled out each year at Callaghan with second year courses being offered from 2025 and third year courses from 2026. You will however be able to enrol in electives at Callaghan from 2024 if you wish.

I commenced my program at Ourimbah, can I move my program to the Callaghan campus?

If you have courses remaining in your program that are now scheduled to be offered at Callaghan you will be able to take these at Callaghan. As courses are being progressively rolled out each year at Callaghan (as listed in the answer above), you will need to ensure however that your required courses are scheduled to be offered at Callaghan in the required terms.

I am studying part-time/planning to take leave in 2024 and I have concerns about completing my remaining courses. What do I do?

Students who are studying part-time or planning to take a leave of absence are encouraged to contact the Program Advice team through askuon@newcastle.edu.au. The Program Advice team will work with you to explore which options will work best.

Is it possible to study courses across both campuses?

Yes. As long as the course is offered at that campus in the required term, students are able to study courses across either campus. You will just need to ensure that you select the correct campus when enrolling in each course. In addition, make sure you account for any travel time when planning your class schedule.
