- The maximum number of units required for completion of this award is 120 units. Students may be awarded Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) of up to 40 units depending on their previous qualifications. All applicants will be advised of any applicable RPL at the time of admission.
- The approximate duration of this program is 1.5 years full time study or part time equivalent.
- The maximum time to complete this program is 5 years.
