To be eligible to graduate make sure you have completed 80 units or 120 units (10 units = 1 course unless otherwise specified) which meet the following criteria:

- Core courses – 60 units.
- Directed courses – 20 units or 60 units visit the [Program Handbook](#) for more information.
- Students who receive Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) complete 20 units of Directed courses instead of 60 units.
- The approximate duration of this program is 1.5 years part-time study.
- The maximum time to complete this program is 5 years.
- The above enrolment pattern is a recommended pattern only. Students who are working whilst studying would typically complete 10-20 units per term.
- Students are able to enrol in Directed Courses in any term.
