120 unit program - To be eligible to graduate make sure you have completed 120 units (10 units = 1 course unless otherwise specified) which meet the following criteria:

- ✓ Core courses - 40 units.
- ✓ Specialisation directed courses/electives (electives must be [6000 level](#)) - 80 units
- ✓ To satisfy the requirements of a specialisation, students must complete 40 units from an [approved specialisation group](#).
- ✓ Students completing a 120 unit program can complete none, one or two specialisations.
- ✓ The maximum time to complete this program is 5 years.
- ✓ The above enrolment pattern is a recommended pattern only. Students who are working whilst studying would typically complete 10-20 units per term.
