Multimode, Simultaneously Delivered Assessment Feedback as a Student-centred Approach to Teaching

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T&L challenges

- 1. Lack of student engagement with course and especially with the assessments and their feedback
- Lack of teaching and learning activities that are personalized to meet individual needs in diverse student cohorts.
- 3. Need to introduce approaches that are equitable to different cohorts, whilst also being personalized and engaging.

Context

- Postgraduate coursework, concurrent face-to-face and online student cohorts
- Courses: Masters of Public Health courses:

PUBH 6300 – Introduction to Public Health

PUBH 6301 – Chronic Disease and Injury Control

PUBH 6302 – Social and Ecosystem Health

PUBH 6304 – Global Health

PUBH 6305 – Global Health Systems & Policy

- Number of students: from 30 to more than 100
- Diverse student cohort:
 - Domestic and International
 - Diverse socioeconomic, educational and professional background
 - Varying age range
 - Part time and full time students

Evaluation

'3-Way Feedback System' received positive student feedback via SFC on item: "I received feedback that was helpful to my leaning"

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Course	SFC on 'Feedback' item BEFORE	SFC on 'Feedback' item AFTER

Qualitative feedback:

- "The feedback given to me on my assessment was really helpful for me as it helped me to improve my next assessment."
- "She gave feedback promptly and used various ways of giving feedback. I
 was thrilled to receive both written and recorded audio feedback on my
 assessments."
- "Thank you for your insightful and helpful feedback. I have really taken on board your suggestions and I hope to implement that on my future assignments. I'm a big fan of the audio feedback and have never come across it in my previous degrees!"

Take home messages:

- 1. Multimode, simultaneous feedback is feasible to deliver and results in increased student satisfaction and decreased complaints
- 2. Audio feedback increased the perceived "personalization" of learning
