The Bachelor of Laws (Honours)/Diploma of Legal Practice is only available to University of Newcastle students who have completed the first degree of a combined Law degree. For the last two years of your Law program you can apply to study the Bachelor of Laws (Honours)/Diploma of Legal Practice, enabling you to be admitted as a lawyer in Australia. Students will have completed 80 units of core LAWS courses within their first degree - Legal System and Method, Torts, Criminal Law and Procedure, and Contracts.

Years 1 - 3: Completion of first degree program of combined Bachelor of Laws (240 units).

Years 4 - 5: Bachelor of Laws (Honours)/Diploma of Legal Practice (200 units).

- ✓ The duration of this program 2 years full time (50 units per semester).
