To be eligible to graduate make sure you have completed 80 units (10 units = 1 course unless otherwise specified) which meet the following criteria:

- ✓ Core courses - 40 units.
- ✓ Directed courses - 40 units.
- ✓ The duration of this program is 1 year full time study or part time equivalent.
- ✓ The maximum time to complete this program is 4 years.
- ✓ The above enrolment pattern is a recommended pattern only. Students who are working whilst studying would typically complete 10-20 units per term.
- ✓ International students studying on campus must complete at least 2 of the following on campus directed courses EPID6430, BIOS6920, PUBH6303, PUBH6305, PUBH6301.
- ✓ International students who commence in Semester 2 are recommended to study PUBH6302, PUBH6301, PUBH6305 and a 10 unit online Directed course.
