Honorary Fellowship	Honorary University Fellow	Awarded to an individual that promotes the work and standing of the University in order to provide enhanced opportunities for recipients to have greater recognition and ongoing affiliation as members of the University's community. These individuals may or may not have an academic background.	- Awarded to an individual who has given exceptional and longstanding service and support to the University and its community. - Access to libraries and computing services may be approved by the Vice-Chancellor. Such organisations may include: • Research institutes; • Other organisations with a significant teaching and/or research role; • Teaching hospitals or Local Health Districts. A formal affiliation agreement would specially address academic and governance matters about research and/or teaching.	• Additional criteria apply as per the Procedure. • Title holders will be expected to contribute to the University in the areas of teaching, research and leadership. • Conjoint title holders are eligible to apply for a title at a higher level via the University of Newcastle's academic promotions process. • Publications of the Conjoint title holder will include the University of Newcastle by-line. • Title holders at Level B and above are eligible to be a primary supervisor for Higher Degree Research students. A candidate may or may not hold a PhD. • Title holders will be expected to contribute to the University in the areas of teaching, research and leadership. • Clinical Conjoint title holders are eligible to apply for a title at a higher level via the University of Newcastle's clinical conjoint academic promotions process. • Publications of the Clinical Conjoint title holder will include the University of Newcastle by-line. These individuals may or may not have an academic background.	- Additional criteria apply as per the Procedure. - Title holders will be expected to contribute to the University in the areas of teaching, research and leadership. - The University may award the title of Adjunct Professor of Practice on individuals from industry without an academic background but of equivalent standing in industry. - Adjunct title holders are eligible to apply for a title at a higher level via the University of Newcastle's academic promotions process. - Publications of the Adjunct title holder will include the University of Newcastle by-line. The academic can be: - A retired academic staff member from the University of Newcastle; or - A retired academic staff member from another University; or - An academic from another university who is to have a continuing relationship with the University of Newcastle.	- Additional criteria apply as per the Procedure. - Title holders will be expected to contribute to the University in the areas of teaching, research and leadership. - When awarded to a retired academic, the level of Honorary title must be the same as the individual's academic level at the time of retirement. - Honorary title holders are eligible to apply for a title at a higher level via the University of Newcastle's academic promotions process. - Retired title holders are not eligible for promotion or re-appointment for a title at a higher level. - Current academics of other universities can request a title at a higher level any time if promoted at their home university.
