Transition Arrangements

The following description outlines the approved transition arrangements for students who commenced in the Master of Applied Finance program prior to 2024. Students who commence the program in 2024 onwards must follow the program structure outlined in the Program Handbook.

Discontinued Courses

Not yet completed

GSBS6140 Investment Analysis (Core) Replacement Course Course added from 2024 onwards

GSBS6147 Investment and Portfolio Management (Core)

GSBS6143 Applied Portfolio Management (Core) Additional 10 units from Course List Select an additional 10 units of courses from the Course List (40 units total)

What does this mean for me?

If you have completed both GSBS6140 and GSBS6143 by the end of 2023, your program requirements will remain unchanged. GSBS6143 and GSBS6140 will continue to count as core courses in your program and you will only need to complete 30 units of courses from the course list. You will not be permitted to study GSBS6147.

If you have not completed both GSBS6140 and GSBS6143 by the end of 2023, you will need to study new core course, GSBS6147, and an additional 10 units of courses from the course list (40 units total) in place of these two courses.

If you have completed GSBS6140 ONLY by the end of 2023, you will need to study new core course, GSBS6147, in place of GSBS6143. You will only need to study 30 units of courses from the course list.

If you have completed GSBS6143 ONLY by the end of 2023, you will need to study an additional 10 units of courses from the course list (40 units total) in place of GSBS6140. You will not be permitted to study GSBS6147.
