What does this mean for me?

Applied Finance Specialisation

If you have completed both GSBS6140 and GSBS6143 by the end of 2023, your specialisation requirements will remain unchanged. GSBS6143 and GSBS6140 will continue to count as compulsory courses in your specialisation. You will not be permitted to study GSBS6147 or GSBS6148.

If you have not completed both GSBS6140 and GSBS6143 by the end of 2023, you will need to study new compulsory courses GSBS6147 and GSBS6148.

If you have completed GSBS6140 ONLY by the end of 2023, you will need to study new core course, GSBS6147, in place of GSBS6143. You will not be permitted to study GSBS6148.

If you have completed GSBS6143 ONLY by the end of 2023, you will need to study new core course, GSBS6148, in place of GSBS6140. You will not be permitted to study GSBS6147.

No Specialisation

If you have completed both GSBS6140 and GSBS6143 by the end of 2023, these courses will continue to count towards your course list requirements. You will not be permitted to study GSBS6147 or GSBS6148.

If you have not completed both GSBS6140 and GSBS6143 by the end of 2023, you will have the option of selecting new course list courses, GSBS6147 and GSBS6148, if you have space within your program. Please note that you will not be permitted to study GSBS6148 if you have completed GSBS6140 and GSBS6147 if you have completed GSBS6143.
