Meet just a few University of Newcastle researchers making a difference on a global scale.

NEW PIONEERS

Professors Chris Levi, Mark Parsons, Neil Spratt and their teams may have found a new treatment to beat the effects of a stroke. Using a well-known heart drug in an entirely new way—on the brain—their approach is being trialled globally and is already having a positive impact.

NEW RE-ENERGISES

Professor Behdad Moghtaderi and his interdisciplinary team's research on methane gases is writing a new chapter in the fight against global warming.

NEW GROWS

Associate Professor Kym Rae founded the Gomeroi gaaynggal project, a long-term study of Indigenous babies' and mothers' health starting before birth and continuing for years into a child's development, to ensure better outcomes.

NEW TRANSFORMS

Laureate Professor Jennifer Gore pioneers new ways to help every student reach their full potential. Her team has introduced ground-breaking research to the Quality Teaching framework, which has been adopted across more than 2,500 Australian schools.

NEW RELIEVES

Professor Paul Dastoor's teams developed a printable saliva-based test of glucose levels for diabetics that could render today's painful blood tests obsolete, plus a method for quickly printing solar power cells, a technique with the potential to transform how we think about sustainability.

NEW ADVOCATES

Dr Amy Maguire advocates for the human dignity of people displaced by climate change. Through her brave research, the millions of people who are forced to flee their homes every year may have a better chance of retaining self-determination and community identity.

NEW CLEARS

Professor Ravi Naidu and his team are on a mission to help remove the 250 gigatons of life-threatening contaminants polluting the world's soil, water and air. His team's work has already improved the lives of thousands of people in Bangladesh by making their water safe.
