



# Sir William Tyree Foundation Scholarship Program in Electrical Engineering

## Terms and Conditions

---

### **BACKGROUND AND SUMMARY OF KEY CONDITIONS**

The intention of this scholarship is to provide financial assistance to new students for the duration of their four (or five) year degree. The scholarship is available to students from the University of Newcastle's [Designated Regions](#) who are commencing a Bachelor of Electrical and Electronic Engineering (Honours).

If accepting an offer of this scholarship, you will:

- Maintain your enrolment and academic progress with the University of Newcastle for the duration of the scholarship.
- Notify [scholarships@newcastle.edu.au](mailto:scholarships@newcastle.edu.au) of any changes to your circumstances - such as reduced study load, change in program, or withdrawal from study - that may impact your eligibility for this scholarship.
- Agree to send a thank-you message to the scholarship donor within two weeks of accepting your offer (as per the instructions in your offer email).
- Be available for a presentation ceremony during Scholars Week (usually around August/September).
- Have an interest in gaining industry engagement and experience with this donor in electrical and mechanical power engineering.

The total maximum value of this scholarship is \$80,000, paid as \$16,000 per annum (\$8,000 each semester) for the standard full-time duration of the recipient's original program (up to a maximum 5 years).

Students studying a single degree may receive up to \$64,000 over a maximum duration of 4 years, while students enrolled in a combined degree that includes the Bachelor of Electrical and Electronic Engineering (Honours) may receive up to \$80,000 for up to 5 years.

### **ESTABLISHMENT**

The Sir William Tyree Foundation would like to support the development of a future skilled workforce in Electrical Engineering through the provision of scholarships for regional and remote undergraduate students to overcome some of the financial hurdles faced by these students.

The scholarship may include opportunities to connect with the Tyree company businesses. Potential Industry engagement opportunities may include career-ready placements, internships, and final year projects. Students who hold scholarships from the Sir William Tyree Foundation are encouraged to find work placements in the electrical engineering industry. The University will seek to ensure a diverse cohort of students is created as the program evolves.

## FUNDING ARRANGEMENT

This scholarship is funded by the Sir William Tyree Foundation.

## ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for this scholarship, you will need to:

- Be enrolled in the first year of a Bachelor of Electrical and Electronic Engineering (Honours) program (including combined degrees) at the University of Newcastle;
- Be intending to study on a full-time basis (minimum 60 units per year);
- Demonstrate that your ability to study is affected, or will be affected, by educational disadvantage such as carer or sole parent responsibilities, financial hardship, a long-term medical condition or disability, the ongoing effects of abuse, regional/remote disadvantage or applicant attributes such as being an Indigenous Australian, having a Refugee background, or placement with an Out-of-Home Care (OOHC) provider. - Reside in one of the University of Newcastle's [Designated Regions](#);
- Be an Australian citizen or an Australian permanent resident (including holders of a permanent humanitarian visa and New Zealand citizens with permanent residency);
- Not hold another University of Newcastle donor-funded or sponsored scholarship concurrently.

## REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION

As part of your application, you will need to prepare:

- A personal statement (approx. 1 A4 page) outlining your academic achievements, career aspirations in the relevant area of study, and how this scholarship would assist you. This statement will cover all scholarships you are applying for.
- You may be required to provide documents supporting your educational disadvantage claim(s) – document requirements (if any) will be identified when you apply based on your scholarships application responses, but to get an idea of what kinds of documents are required please see UAC's [equity scholarship categories and supporting documents page](#).
- The application will include a free text question asking you to outline your interest in associated future opportunities with this donor and/or Industry partner.

Any applicant that does not submit the required documentation, including documentary evidence, will not be considered for selection.

As part of your application, you will need to agree to the terms and conditions regarding privacy and collection of personal information set out in the Declaration and Authority at the start of your application.

## SELECTION

Selection is a competitive process and will be based on assessment of the scholarship application and any required supporting documents, with reference to the eligibility criteria.

Selection will be made by the College of Engineering, Science and Environment Selection Panel which will consist of a minimum of three members chosen by the Pro Vice-Chancellor - Engineering, Science and Environment. A representative from The Sir William Tyree Foundation will be invited to join the selection panel and interviews may be arranged, if required.

The Selection Panel will communicate the details of successful recipients to the Scholarships Office, and all applicants will be notified of an outcome via email within 6 weeks of the scholarship application closing date. Where there is only one eligible applicant for a scholarship, the Scholarships Office may award without referral to a selection panel, in consultation with the Office of Alumni and Philanthropy.

## CONDITIONS OF AWARD

If accepting this scholarship, you agree to the following conditions:

- You will continue to meet all relevant criteria in the [Eligibility section](#) above for the duration of the scholarship, unless [special consideration](#) (see below) is approved.
- If your circumstances change in a way that impacts your eligibility (e.g., change in study load or withdrawal from study), you will notify [scholarships@newcastle.edu.au](mailto:scholarships@newcastle.edu.au).
- This scholarship is subject to semester review. Continuation of the scholarship and payment of the scholarship benefit are subject to the scholar maintaining satisfactory academic progress, that is, GPA of 4.0 or higher, and continuing to meet the eligibility criteria of the scholarship.
- The scholarship is tenable for up to 5 years and must be taken up in the year for which it was awarded, unless otherwise specified.
- You agree to send a thank-you message to the scholarship donor within two weeks of accepting your offer, following the instructions in your scholarship offer letter.
- You will be available to attend a presentation ceremony during Scholars Week (usually around August - September) where you may have opportunity to meet with the donors and/or their representatives.

## BENEFIT

This scholarship provides a total benefit of up to \$64,000 for students in a single degree, or up to \$80,000 for students in an eligible combined degree. The scholarship benefit will be paid as \$8,000 a semester for the standard full-time duration of the recipient's original degree (up to a maximum of 5 years) provided ongoing eligibility is met.

Payments are typically received 2–3 weeks after the semester census date, or 2–3 weeks after you accept your offer if the census date has already passed.

The scholarship benefit and number of scholarships awarded may vary and will be determined by the funding available each year.

## PERIODS OF LEAVE

You may apply in writing to [scholarships@newcastle.edu.au](mailto:scholarships@newcastle.edu.au) for consideration to reserve your scholarship if you are unable to study due to illness, injury, or other extenuating circumstances. An application must be supported by documentary evidence.

Periods of approved leave for the scholarship:

- must not exceed two consecutive semesters of study; and
- will not be counted towards the term of the scholarship.

## TERMINATION

Unless terminated earlier, the scholarship will end when the term has expired, and the total benefit has been paid.

The Scholarships Office may terminate the scholarship before the term has expired if:

- The scholarship conditions are not met, including relevant eligibility criteria being maintained.
- The scholar completes study and/or ceases to be a student with the University of Newcastle; or
- The scholar has committed serious misconduct (as determined in accordance with the University's relevant policies and rules).

If the scholarship is terminated early, the Office of Alumni and Philanthropy will be advised and the donor notified. Ongoing scholarships will not be paid out in full in instances where the recipient completes or discontinues study before the full scholarship term has expired.

If you have provided false or misleading information and as a result you were awarded or continued to receive the scholarship, the scholarship may be stopped, and you may be required to repay any scholarship benefits to which you are not entitled to within 14 days of being requested to do so by the University.

## **SPECIAL CONSIDERATION**

As a scholarship recipient, if you are unable to meet the conditions of the scholarship due to illness, injury or other extenuating circumstances, you may apply for special consideration. Please apply by writing to the Scholarships Office via email to [scholarships@newcastle.edu.au](mailto:scholarships@newcastle.edu.au). Please provide appropriate documentary evidence to support your request.

A decision will be made by Scholarships staff in consultation with the Office of Alumni & Philanthropy.

## **PRIVACY AND COLLECTION OF PERSONAL INFORMATION**

If applying for a donor-funded scholarship, the application or a summary of information provided with the application may be provided to an external donor and/or their representative. This is for the purpose of scholarship selection and otherwise to inform the donor that the terms of the donation are met.

You may be asked by Scholarships staff if you give permission for any short articles or newsletter items to be published. You may have the option to provide a photo, quote or short paragraph about yourself for this.

The University of Newcastle is committed to the protection of your personal information and privacy. The University will only disclose your personal information to the extent necessary for the purpose of the provision of this scholarship (including scholarship selection and assessing ongoing eligibility requirements).
