Auditions Held: Saturday 7 November 2015. Everyone who applies for a scholarship will be given the opportunity to audition and must be available on this day at the time they are allocated. Auditions will not be held on any other days and times cannot be changed once the schedule is confirmed. You will be advised of your audition details by email.

Value of Scholarship: Minimum value \$1,256.00. Exact value to be confirmed (dependant on 2016 fees). The individual tuition term fees will be discounted by over \$100 per term. The student will also receive a free ensemble and free Music Craft class (enrolment is compulsory).

The following conditions apply to all Community Music Scholarships awarded by The Conservatorium.

- 1. Applicants must be residents of the state of New South Wales.
- 2. Successful applicants are required to be enrolled in an ensemble and a Music Craft class (free of charge).
- 3. Applicants will be examined on two contrasting works of their own choice and will be expected to bring with them copies of the music to be performed.
- 4. Applicants in instruments other than keyboard or guitar should bring an accompanist with them to the audition.
- 5. Scholarships will not be awarded unless candidates are of sufficient merit.
- 6. Scholarships are tenable from term to term, and renewal will be subject to good conduct, satisfactory progress and regular and punctual attendance at all classes. The Community Music Programs Coordinator may terminate a Scholarship at any time.
- 7. The Conservatorium Community Music Scholarship holders are expected to assist in general Conservatorium activities as required. Any serious deficiency in this regard may result in disentitlement of the Scholarship.
- 8. Professional musicians or enrolled tertiary students are not eligible to hold a Conservatorium Community Music Scholarship. The scholarships are open to primary and secondary school students or vocalists up to the age of 25 who have not been an enrolled student at any University.
- 9. The teacher in the practical study of the scholarship may be selected by the Community Programs Coordinator.
- 10. The Community Programs Coordinator's decision in all matters shall be final.
- 11. Applications for the Scholarships must be made on the appropriate form and lodged with The Conservatorium administration office by the prescribed date.
