What does this mean for me?

If you have completed both COMP6500 and INFT2031 by the end of 2023, your program requirements will remain unchanged. You will not be permitted to study any additional courses from the course list. Your core courses will not be impacted.

If you have not completed both COMP6500 and INFT2031 by the end of 2023, you will need to study the remaining directed courses from the new course list. Your core courses will not be impacted.

Frequently Asked Questions

On the program handbook, INFT6160, COMP6600 and PSYC6060 have been added as a core courses. If I started prior to 2024, do I need to complete these new courses?

No. Students who commenced the program prior to 2024 should follow the program structure outlined in their Program Planner. This will involve continuing to study core courses, SENG6250 and COMP6360, as well as 20 units from the directed course list.

I studied a course that was previously listed in the directed course list, however this course is not on the list above. Does this still count towards my program?

Yes. Any directed course completed in this program prior to 2024 will continue to count towards your progression. You will see this reflected in Program Planner.
