Please note students may be required to complete 80-120 units to finish their program (please see page 4). The enrolment plan above is a recommended full time enrolment pattern for students required to complete 120 units.

To be eligible to graduate make sure you have completed 120 units (10 units = 1 course unless otherwise specified) which meet the following criteria:

- ✓ Core Courses – minimum of 20 Units, maximum of 40 Units.
- ✓ Directed Courses – minimum of 40 Units, maximum of 60 Units.
- ✓ Elective Courses – 20 Units.
- ✓ Electives can be chosen from across UoN offerings at 6000 level. See Course Handbook for elective options.
- ✓ The maximum number of units required for completion of this award is 120. Students may be awarded Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) of up to 40 units depending on their previous qualification. All applicants will be advised of any applicable Advanced Standing at the time of admission.
- ✓ The approximate duration of this program is 1.5 years full time study, or part time equivalent.
- ✓ The maximum time to complete this program is 5 years.
