To be eligible to graduate make sure you have completed 80 units (10 units = 1 course unless otherwise specified) which meet the following criteria:

- ✓ Specialisation Compulsory courses - 50 Units
- ✓ Specialisation Directed courses - 30 Units.
- ✓ Students undertaking the Alcohol and Other Drugs stream are required to do 100 hours of practical experience in MEDI6145 and MED6160 (50 hours in each course)
- ✓ Stroke Management specialisation must be completed in a minimum of three Semesters due to assumed knowledge for MEDI6350
- ✓ The duration of this program is 1 year full time study, or part time equivalent
- ✓ The maximum time to complete this program is 4 years
- ✓ The above enrolment pattern is a recommended pattern only. Students who are working whilst studying would typically complete 10-20 units per term
