- ✓ Core courses - 320 units.
- ✓ Directed courses - 70 units. Refer to the [Program Handbook](#) for the list of Directed courses.
- ✓ Electives - 10 units. Visit the [Course Handbook](#) to see a list of available Electives.
- ✓ Students must not exceed 120 units at 1000 level.
- ✓ The duration of this program is 5 years full time (40 units per semester).
- ✓ The maximum time to complete this program is 8 years.
