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To be eligible to graduate make sure you have completed 80 units (10 units = 1 course unless otherwise specified) which meet the following criteria:

- Core courses – 10 units
- Directed Core courses – 20 units
- Directed Courses – 50 units (10 units from Group A, 10 units from Group B, and the remaining 30 units from any list in the handbook)
- The duration of this program is 1 year full-time (80 units across one academic year) or part-time equivalent.
- The maximum time to complete this program is 4 years.
