To be eligible to graduate make sure you have completed 400 units (10 units = 1 course unless otherwise specified) which meet the following criteria:

- Core courses - 260 units
- Development Studies Major - 80 units (including all Compulsory courses and the required number of Directed courses for one Major sequence from the Bachelor of Development Studies).
- Development Studies Directed course - 10 units at the 2000/3000 level.
- Courses taken as Directed courses cannot also be counted towards a Major.
- LAWS Directed courses - 50 units. Refer to the [Program Handbook](#) for the list of Directed courses. The duration of this program is 5 years full time (40 units persemester).
- The maximum time to complete this program is 8 years.
- Please note Directed courses changed from 5000 level to 6000 level in 2021, all 5000 level courses completed prior to 2021 and will count as 6000 level courses
