- The maximum number of units required for completion of this award is 160. Students may be awarded Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) of up to 80 units depending on their previous qualification. All applicants will be advised of any applicable RPL at the time of admission. Please visit the [Program Handbook](#) for information about RPL and applicable pathway.
- The program consists of:
 - Core courses – 80 units
 - Directed courses – 80 units
- The approximate duration of this program is 2 years full time study, or part time equivalent.
- The maximum time to complete this program is 6 years.
- The above enrolment pattern complies with the conditions of international student visas. Failing to follow this enrolment advice may result in international students not being able to graduate within the period of their Confirmation of Enrolment.
- Future availability of courses is subject to change.
- Part time students typically enrol in 10-20 units each Trimester.
