To be eligible to graduate make sure you have completed 80 units (10 units = 1 course unless otherwise specified) which meet the following criteria:

- ✓ Core Courses - 40 Units.
- ✓ Directed Courses – 40 units:
 - ✓ You must complete at least one Directed Course from Group A.
 - ✓ You must complete at least one Directed Course from Group B.
 - ✓ The remaining two courses can be selected from either Group A or Group B.
 - ✓ Check requisites for each course in the course handbook
- ✓ The recommended duration of this program is 1 year full time study, or part time equivalent.
- ✓ The maximum time to complete this program is 4 years.
- ✓ Course availability is subject to change.
