BACHELOR OF SOCIAL SCIENCE

To be eligible to graduate make sure you have completed 240 units (10 units = 1 course unless otherwise specified) which meet the following criteria:

- ✓ Core courses - 80 units.
- ✓ Major Courses - 80 units (including compulsory courses).
- ✓ Social Science Directed Courses - 40 units of courses. Any course listed in the Bachelor of Social Science [Program Handbook](#) (excluding Core courses) will count as a Social Science Directed Course
- ✓ Elective Courses- 40 units. Visit the [Course Handbook](#) to see a list of available Electives.
- ✓ Some Major courses are only available at the Callaghan or Newcastle Precinct campuses. Ourimbah students will need to travel to Callaghan or Newcastle if they wish to complete these Majors.
- ✓ Students must complete a minimum of 40 units at all levels (1000, 2000 and 3000), and can complete a maximum of 100 units at 1000 level.
- ✓ Students who perform well during the Bachelor of Social Science program with a credit average (GPA of 5.0) or greater, may apply for a further year of full time (or equivalent part time) study to obtain an Honours degree.
- ✓ The duration of this program is 3 years full time study (40 units per semester) or part time equivalent.
- ✓ The maximum time to complete this program is 8 years.
