Our FREE Yapug pathway program is designed for Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander people to gain entry into undergraduate degrees. Yapug offers flexible study options including full-time and part-time study. To be eligible, you must be turning 18 years or older and have confirmation of your status as an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander person.


YOUR GUARANTEED PATHWAY TO A DEGREE

Upon successful completion of Yapug, you will be guaranteed early entry into over 40+ degrees at the University of Newcastle.

You'll also be able to use your final grades from the program for competitive admission to all other University of Newcastle degrees including Medicine. Your application is free of charge and made directly to the University*. Offers will be made before the end of December in the year you study.

Yapug is also recognised as an entry qualification for many other universities and training providers around Australia.

* A UAC application is required to study a Bachelor of Midwifery or Medicine.

To successfully complete Yapug, you're required to complete course areas with a combined total of 80 units. It's important to consider what degree you'd like to study upon the completion of Yapug, as the courses you choose can help prepare you for that area of study.

As a Yapug student, you are eligible to apply for Indigenous Enabling Scholarships, designed to help you financially during your studies. If you relocate to Newcastle to take the program you may also be eligible for additional financial support. The Yapug program is recognised by Centrelink regarding eligibility for financial assistance through the ABSTUDY scheme.
