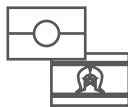
DO YOU IMAGINE WORKING IN YOUR DREAM JOB? ARE YOU LOOKING TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE TO YOUR COMMUNITY? REGARDLESS OF YOUR QUALIFICATIONS, EXPERIENCE OR PREVIOUS MARKS, YAPUG CAN MAKE YOUR DREAMS A REALITY.

Yapug is a free pathway program offered at the University of Newcastle for Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander peoples who do not have the qualifications required for direct entry into an undergraduate degree program. Not only is Yapug designed to help you gain entry, it helps you develop the skills needed for successful study at a university level.

To be eligible for a place you must be:

18+

turning 18 years of age or more in the year of study

YOUR GUARANTEED PATHWAY TO A UON DEGREE

Upon successful completion of Yapug, you will be guaranteed early entry into selected degrees at the University of Newcastle.

You'll also be able to use your final grades from the program for competitive admission to all other UON degrees including Medicine. Your application is free of charge and made directly to the University*. Offers will be made before the end of December in the year you study.

Yapug is also recognised as an entry qualification for many universities and training providers around Australia.

* A UAC application is required to study a Bachelor of Midwifery.

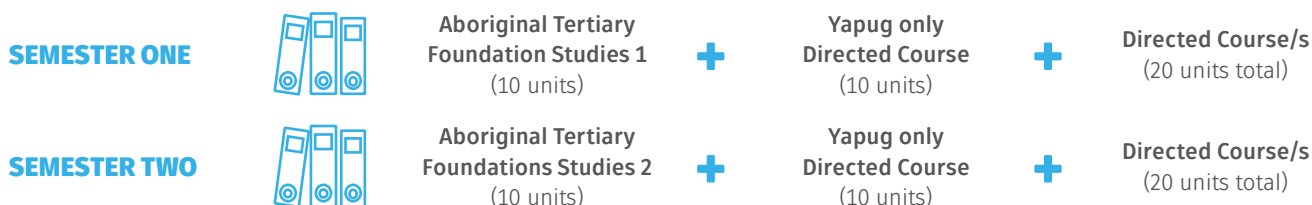
LEADERS IN INDIGENOUS EDUCATION

UON has an outstanding track record in Indigenous education with more than 1000 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students were enrolled at the University across all faculties and study levels. Our enrolment of Indigenous students is significantly higher than the national average, maintaining the University's national leadership role in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Higher Education.

As a student of Yapug, you will benefit from a range of exclusive support services offered by the Wollotuka Institute and English Language and Foundation Studies centre, including academic and tutorial assistance, a well-equipped resource centre, audiovisual materials on Indigenous topics and issues, counselling and health services, as well as social and cultural programs.

WHAT YOU'LL STUDY

To successfully complete Yapug, you're required to complete course areas with a combined total of 80 units. It's important to consider what degree you'd like to study upon the completion of Yapug, as the courses you choose can help prepare you for that area of study.

SCHOLARSHIPS

As a Yapug student, you are eligible to apply for Indigenous Enabling Scholarships, designed to help you financially during your studies. If you relocate to Newcastle to take the program you may also be eligible for additional financial support. The Yapug program is recognised by Centrelink regarding eligibility for financial assistance through the ABSTUDY scheme.
