

- **Enhanced Regional Linkages:** Improvements in transport corridors and freight facilities will facilitate economic growth, making it easier for businesses to operate and expand.
- **Planned expansion of Newcastle Airport by 2030** which will see it double, expanding the region's tourism industry and enhancing connections with the Asia-Pacific.
- **Home to world-class research institutions** including the University of Newcastle, Hunter Medical Research Institute (HMRI), Commonwealth Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation (CSIRO) and Newcastle Institution for Energy and Resources (NIER).

The region's strategic growth areas include advanced manufacturing, creative industries, defence and aerospace, food and agribusiness, medical technology and pharmaceuticals, mining equipment and services, and renewable energy.

These initiatives will not only drive economic success but also create new opportunities for innovation and collaboration for the health and medical industry.

## Our clinical partners

It includes two acute hospitals: Gosford Hospital, the principal referral and regional trauma centre, and Wyong Hospital, a major metropolitan facility.
