To be eligible to graduate you need to have completed 400 units.

- ✓ Core courses = 400 units.
- ✓ The Bachelor of Medical Science and Doctor of Medicine programs are undertaken sequentially over 5 years of full-time study (40 units per semester)
- ✓ Years 1 - 3 = Bachelor of Medical Science and Years 4 – 5 = Doctor of Medicine
- ✓ Students enrol on a semester basis with the delivery of the academic content occurring across the full year

- ✓ This program contains clinical/professional placements. Students must meet [NSW Health Verification Requirements](#) and obtain a WorkCover approved First Aid Certificate.
