ACTIVE TRAVEL

Ride, walk, skate – active travel options are some of the most efficient and effective ways to incorporate regular exercise into our daily lives and reduce our carbon footprint. Modern end-of-trip facilities are located on the ground floor of University House with showers, lockers and secure bike storage for over 215 bikes. PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Buses, trains and ferries service the City from all across Newcastle, Lake Macquarie, Central Coast and the Lower Hunter. You can plan your trip using the Newcastle Transport website.

Opal Cards, accepted on both buses and trains, are the most convenient and cost effective way to travel by public transport.

Public buses to Newcastle pick up passengers at both the Maths, and Design bus stops at Callaghan. The Hunter train line stops at Warabrook station and terminates at Wickham Interchange, with the light rail now taking you to the Newcastle City Campus and the beach.

PARK AND RIDE

Why drive past Callaghan on your way to the city. Park your car at Callaghan and catch the free NeW Space Shuttle to the city campus. The shuttle from Callaghan to NeW Space commences from 7.15am on weekdays, and concludes weeknights with a 10.15pm service from NeW Space to Callaghan.

During semester teaching periods, including exam periods, the shuttle runs at 30-minute intervals. There are a number of pick up points across Callaghan campus close to student accommodation, the library, and public bus stops. When parking your car at Callaghan you still need to display a valid parking permit or purchase a parking ticket from the ticket machines located within the car parks. To board the bus you will need to use your staff or student identification.

RIDE SHARE

Ridesharing is a smarter way to get to campus. You can save money, share your drive, meet new friends and reduce your carbon footprint while travelling to campus.

The University of Newcastle exclusive Liftango app aims to match riders with drivers to make Ridesharing easy. Within the Laman Street car park there are 20 dedicated Rideshare bays conveniently located behind the Conservatorium. To access these car parks you need to use the free Liftango app and display a staff or student parking permit, or buy a car park ticket.

The app is free to download and free to use. Find the Liftango app at the App Store or Google Play.

DRIVE AND PARK

There are no parking spaces in the NeW Space building. If you plan to drive to the City Campus, the University has leased 150 spaces at the Civic West car parking station located off Gibson Street. To use the Civic West car park, staff and students will first need to register as a user via the UON website or through the NeW Space app. The car park uses licence plate recognition technology to charge users. Once you register you can park for as little as \$2.50 per hour up to a flat fee of \$10 a day on levels 8-11 in our University of Newcastle exclusive spaces.

Visitors to NeW Space will need to find individual transport solutions that meet their needs and these can include on street parking, parking in nearby parking stations, catching public transport or using a taxi service.
