Program Plan Key: = Core = Directed Course = Elective

To be eligible to graduate make sure you have completed 240 units (10 units = 1 course unless otherwise specified) which meet the following criteria:

✓ Core courses - 120 units **and one of the following:**

- **Single Major Pathway** – 80 units of Directed courses for one Major sequence, with 20 units at 1000 level, 20 units at 2000 level and 40 units at 3000 level; **and** 40 units of Electives;

or

- **Double Minor Pathway** – 60 units of Directed courses for one Minor sequence; **and** 60 units of Directed courses for second Minor sequence. Each course may only be counted towards one minor with 20 units at 1000, 20 units at 2000 and 20 units at 3000 level for each minor sequence. This option utilises the 40 units of Electives as part of the minors;

or

- **Directed Course Pathway** - 80 units of Directed courses chosen from all Directed courses in the program, with 20 units at 1000 level, 20 units at 2000 level and 40 units at 2000 or 3000 level; **and** 40 units of Electives.

✓ Visit the [Course Handbook](#) to see a list of available Electives.

✓ Students must complete a minimum of 40 units at all levels (1000, 2000, and 3000), and can complete a maximum of 100 units at 1000 level.

✓ Students who perform well during the program with a credit average (GPA of 5.0) or greater, may apply for a further year of full time (or equivalent part time) study to obtain an Honours degree.

✓ The duration of this program is 3 years full time study (40 units per semester) or part time equivalent.

✓ The maximum time to complete this program is 8 years.
