To be eligible to graduate make sure you have completed 280 units (10 units = 1 course unless otherwise specified) which meet the following criteria:

- ✓ Core Courses - 200 Units.
- ✓ Directed Courses - 80 Units.
- ✓ First year core courses are assumed knowledge for all remaining core courses and should be completed before progressing through the program or commencing Legal Practice.
- ✓ The duration of this program is 3 years full time study, or part time equivalent.
- ✓ The maximum time to complete this program is 8 years.
