What does this mean for me?

Final Project Course

If you have completed both SENG6210A & SENG6210B by the end of 2023, these courses will continue to count as core courses in your program. You will not need to study COMP6900.

If you have not completed both SENG6210A & SENG6210B by the end of 2023, you will need to study COMP6900 (20 units) as a core course in your program. Please note that SENG6210A & SENG6210B needed to be completed within the same calendar year. If you only passed Part A in 2023 you will need to complete COMP6900 in 2024.

COMP6360, SENG6250 & COMP6500

If you have completed all three of these courses by the end of 2023, these courses will continue to count as core courses in your program. You will not need to study any of the replacement courses.

If you have not completed all three of these courses by the end of 2023, you will need to study any remaining units from the provided course list. Any courses completed prior to 2024 will continue to count towards these 30 units.
