To be eligible to graduate make sure you have completed 320 units (10 units = 1 course unless otherwise specified) which meet the following criteria:

- ✓ Core courses (including Professional Placement) - 260 units.
- ✓ Compulsory - 30 units (Ungraded Honours) or 60 units (Graded Honours).
- ✓ Directed courses - 10 units (Ungraded Honours only). Must be chosen from an area different to your Principal Studio courses.
- ✓ Electives - 20 units (Ungraded Honours) or 10 units (Graded Honours). Visit the [Course Handbook](#) to see a list of available Electives.
- ✓ Students must not exceed 100 units at any level (1000, 2000, 3000 or 4000).
- ✓ All students who complete the requirements of the program will be eligible for Ungraded Honours. High performing students who meet the eligibility requirements will be able to complete Graded Honours. Students completing Ungraded Honours may undertake a Minor in History or Drama, please see the Bachelor of Teaching (Fine Art) (Honours) History or Drama Minor Program Plan for information about the requirements to complete a Minor within the program.
- ✓ The duration of this program is 4 years full time study (40 units per semester) or part time equivalent.
- ✓ The maximum time to complete this program is 10 years.
