

Sustainability

Sustainability is a key priority of the University of Newcastle' Looking Ahead Strategic Plan 2020-2025. Here are a few of the ways we are reducing our environmental impact:

- Gas boosted solar hot water, LED lighting and motion sensors have been installed across all of our tower accommodation residences
- All lighting upgrades are replaced with LEDs
- 2 hour timers are installed on all air conditioners
- Drought proof native plants are used throughout the precinct to limit watering requirements
- 5-star energy rated fridges, freezers and AV equipment are supplied
- All mattresses are recycled at end of life
- All residents are encouraged and supported to compost and recycle their waste.
- ResShop - where residents drop off household items still in great condition, so new and current residents can shop sustainably for essentials.

Establishing Status within the university

Available on the University's website, the Establishing Status Policy reflects the University's commitment to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples and Reconciliation as outlined in the University's Strategic Plan and Reconciliation Action Plan.

Upon successful completion of the Establishing Aboriginality and/or Torres Strait Islander Status Procedure, Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander students will receive access to guaranteed accommodation on campus* (completion of an accommodation application is also required).

After Hours Duty Officers



24/7 Campus Security

The University provides trained security officers to help ensure you and your property are safe on campus. These officers are here 24/7, 365 days a year.

Services provided by the Campus Security team include first aid and emergency response, vehicle and foot patrols, CCTV monitoring, safe walk service and operation of the Callaghan Campus Security Shuttle service.



Residential Mentors

Residential Mentors (RMs) are residents employed by Student Living. They are responsible for supporting the wellbeing of our residents, assisting in the transition to independent living and providing general support for the unique experience of living on campus. To help you get to know your housemates and stay up-to-date with what's happening at Student Living, your RM will hold regular meetings and activities.

Your RM is your first port of call for any questions, queries, support or help. Whether your concern is dealing with homesickness or where to pick up your student card, your RM will point you in the right direction.

RMs are provided with extensive training including Senior First Aid, mental health, sexual consent, anti-hazing, creating respectful environments and drug and alcohol education.



Residential Associations

Your Residential Association represents your whole residence and organises great events like formal dinners, sport competitions and opportunities to get involved with charities to help you contribute to your community.




Built around a central courtyard and named for the Awabakal word meaning 'a bright place to live', Barahineban offers a unique residential experience.



Getting Around



Access via train is available for both Callaghan (Warabrook station) and Central Coast campuses (Ourimbah station).

Studying at NUspace? The Newcastle Light Rail's Civic stop is right at our doorstep.



On weekdays during semester, a free shuttle operates around Callaghan campus, including Warabrook train station. This shuttle is on-call until midnight.

The Ourimbah campus security shuttle departs from the bus stop on Loop Road but will come to your location on request. The service also includes drop off and pick up to Ourimbah Railway Station by request.



A free city shuttle also runs between Callaghan and NUspace every 30 minutes during semester.



There are approximately 700 car spaces available exclusively to residents as long as you have a Residential Parking Permit.



A free, resident-exclusive shuttle bus runs every Tuesday afternoon, Thursday night and Saturday afternoon to Jesmond Central shopping centre.


