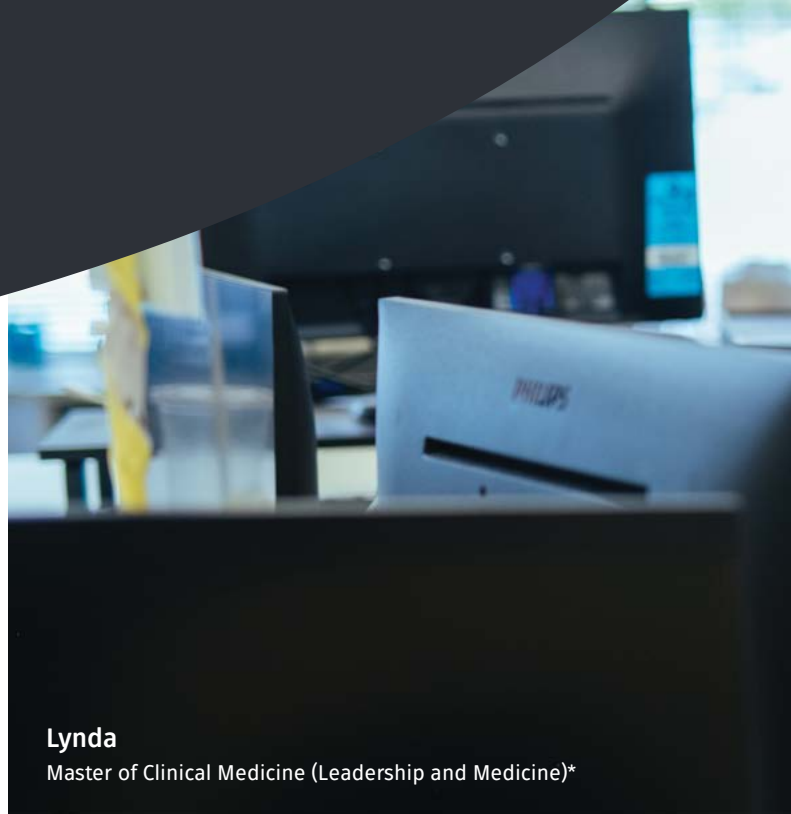

Which degree is for you?

There are over 90 postgraduate coursework degrees available for you to choose from. Whether you want to dip your toes into further study via a Graduate Certificate or are ready for a longer commitment via a Graduate Diploma or Masters qualification, there is something available to suit your needs.

Always check the program handbook available via a degree's dedicated web page, where you will find admission requirements and other information to help you decide if the program is right for you.

Graduate Certificate

40 units typically completed in 0.5 years full-time study or part-time equivalent, designed to achieve the specified learning outcomes. A Graduate Certificate allows you to further advance your current career or embark on a new one and is a pathway for further learning.

Graduate Diploma

80 units typically completed in one (1) year full-time study or part-time equivalent, designed to achieve the specified learning outcomes. Graduate Diplomas can also provide a pathway to further learning.

Masters

A Masters Degree (Coursework) program is typically one (1) to two (2) years full-time or part-time equivalent, designed to achieve the specified learning outcomes. These degrees can vary in length; some are 80 units with the longest being 240 units.

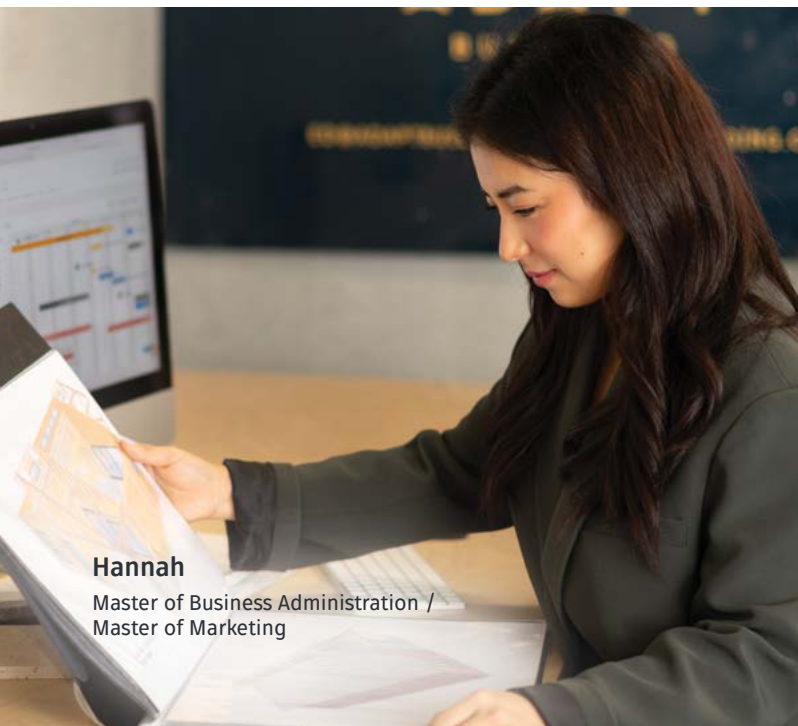
Higher Degrees by Research (HDR)

A Doctor of Philosophy (PhD), typically completed in 3.5 years full-time or Master of Philosophy (MPhil) degree, typically completed in two (2) years full-time, will connect you with the top tier of researchers.

This opens up incredible opportunities to advance your career, pursue breakthrough discoveries, and solve the world's most formidable problems. The University offers Higher Degrees by Research programs in our areas of research specialisation.

While some choose to undertake a minor thesis first through a Masters coursework qualification, depending on your background and research experience you may apply directly into an MPhil or PhD degree.

Application fee

It is free to complete an application for programs that offer direct entry through the University of Newcastle.

Commonwealth Supported Places

A number of our postgraduate programs offer Commonwealth Supported Places (CSP), allowing eligible students to be charged at the government subsidised rate. Eligibility will be automatically assessed during the application process and successful students can defer their contributions through HECS-HELP.

Fee-paying programs

These are degrees without Commonwealth Supported Places. Eligible domestic students can apply for an interest-free loan through the FEE-HELP loan scheme, deferring payment until earning above the minimum salary threshold.

Financial assistance

We offer support systems, including scholarships and emergency loans, to help with study costs. You may also be eligible for Australian Government assistance with HECS-HELP and FEE-HELP loans, and income support.

Financing your studies

Out-of-pocket course fees may be tax deductible if related to your current work activities. Check with the Australian Taxation Office for eligibility.

Scholarships

Each year, more than \$4 million in scholarships is awarded to students. Our scholarship programs align with the University's values of excellence, equity, sustainability, and engagement. Many scholarships result from generous philanthropic donations, reflecting our belief that talent and dedication deserve support. Don't rule yourself out; apply for all scholarships you meet the criteria for.

Student Services and Amenities Fee (SSAF)

All students must pay an SSAF to fund non-academic services and amenities. Eligible students can defer payment as part of the enrolment process.

If the course is relevant to your current career, speak with your manager about covering costs as part of professional development.

Application process

For most postgraduate coursework degrees, you can complete an easy, online application form. Applying only takes around 10 minutes and there is no fee for direct applications.

Credit

The University of Newcastle acknowledges the expert skills and knowledge many of our postgraduate students bring to their program of study. A number of our programs have entry pathways that recognise both academic qualifications and professional experience, and Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) is granted to eligible students upon admission to their program.

For programs that do not offer these pathways, credit may be awarded for formal, informal and non-formal learning. If you have studies as part of an incomplete equivalent program, microcredentials or extensive relevant professional experience, you can apply for credit towards a specific course or courses within your program via CATS. If applying on the basis of relevant professional experience, make sure you include the Application for Recognition of Prior Learning form.

If you are not an Australian citizen, New Zealand citizen, or the holder of an Australian Permanent Residency visa, you are able to apply directly through our International Office or via an education agent, depending on your home country.

Associate Professor, Dr Myles Young

School of Psychological Sciences

Dr Myles Young is a multiple national-award winning mid-career researcher who has led multiple clinical trials targeting men's physical and mental health, with a particular interest in physical activity and its role in mental health promotion. Myles is the program convenor for the Graduate Diploma in Psychological Sciences.

Myles has published 63 journal articles in leading international journals, which have been cited over 3,000 times, proving his ability to conceptualise and publish high quality mental health research studies.

During his career, Young has successfully secured over \$8M in competitive grant income, awarded by national and international funding bodies.

He is currently leading the first randomised trial internationally comparing the value of outdoor walk-and-talk therapy for men with low mood, compared to usual care.

Myles has received over 20 awards recognising his real-world impact of his work. In 2019 he was named BUPA Emerging Health Researcher of the Year, and in 2020 was named one in 40 AMP Foundation 'Tomorrow Makers'. In 2022, he received the University of Newcastle's Teaching Excellence Award, the University's highest teaching honour, for his undergraduate and postgraduate courses focused on evidence-based practice in psychotherapy.

Professor Zsolt Balogh is an internationally recognised academic and active practicing trauma and orthopaedic surgeon.

Dr Balogh is Professor of Surgery at the University of Newcastle's School of Medicine and Public Health and convening the Master of Traumatology postgraduate program. He is responsible for the Surgical and Trauma curriculum at the University of Newcastle and supervises the Traumatology PhD Program.

Dr Balogh is the recipient of Australia's most prestigious surgical research award, the John Mitchell Crouch fellowship of the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons and the Australian Orthopaedic Associations Research Award.

He is the top researcher of Australia in the field of Emergency Medicine; 2020 and 2021 The Australian – Report on Research.

He has a research output highlighted by over 400 peer-reviewed publications and has more than 32,000 citations.

Dr Balogh is a member of numerous professional and academic medical societies and editor of several peer-reviewed scientific journals. He is Chair of the Australasian Trauma Care Verification Program, has been a past President of the Australasian Orthopaedic Trauma Society, Research chair for the ANZ Society for the Surgery of Trauma and for the NSW Institute of Injury and Trauma Management.
