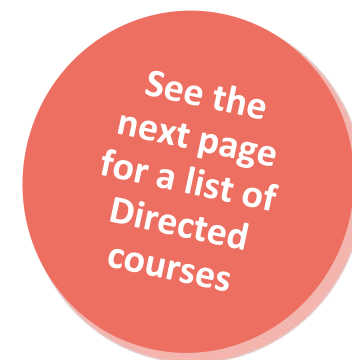
To be eligible to graduate make sure you have completed 280 units (10 units = 1 course unless otherwise specified) which meet the following criteria:

- ✓ Core Courses - 200 Units.
- ✓ Directed Courses - 80 Units.
- ✓ First year core courses (LAWS6000, LAWS6001, LAWS6120, LAWS6121, LAWS6130, LAWS6140, and LAWS6141) are assumed knowledge for all remaining core courses and should be completed before progressing through the program or commencing Legal Practice.
- ✓ Students are able to enrol via MyHuB into LAWS6000 for the [Winter Term](#) and LAWS6001 for Semester 2.
- ✓ Students must submit a [manual enrolment form](#) to Law-School@newcastle.edu.au to complete their enrolment in LAWS6120 and LAWS6121.
- ✓ The duration of this program is 3 years full time study, or part time equivalent.
- ✓ The maximum time to complete this program is 8 years.
