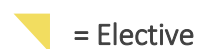
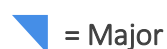
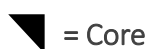

To be eligible to graduate make sure you have completed 240 units (10 units = 1 course unless otherwise specified) which meet the following criteria:

- ✓ Core courses - 100 units.
- ✓ Major courses - 80 or 90 units (depending on the Major chosen).
- ✓ Directed courses - 10 units.
- ✓ Electives - A minimum of 40 units. Visit the [Course Handbook](#) to see a list of available Electives.
- ✓ Students can only take 1 major in this program.
- ✓ Students must not exceed 100 units at 1000 level.
- ✓ Students must take a minimum of 60 units at 3000 level.
- ✓ The duration of this program is 3 years full time (40 units per semester) or part time equivalent.
- ✓ The maximum time to complete this program is 8 years.
