To be eligible to graduate make sure you have completed 240 units (10 units = 1 course unless otherwise specified) which meet the following criteria:

- ✓ Core courses - 80 units.
- ✓ Major Courses - 80 units (including compulsory courses).
- ✓ Approved Social Science Courses - 40 units of courses. These can come from any major within the Bachelor of Social Science.
- ✓ Elective Courses- 40 units. Visit the [Course Handbook](#) to see a list of available Electives.
- ✓ Some Major courses are only available at Callaghan campus. Ourimbah students will need to travel to Callaghan if they wish to complete these Majors.
- ✓ Students must complete a minimum of 40 units at all levels (1000, 2000 and 3000), and can complete a maximum of 100 units at 1000 level.
- ✓ Students who perform well during the Bachelor of Social Science program with a credit average (GPA of 5.0) or greater, may apply for a further year of full time (or equivalent part time) study to obtain an Honours degree.
- ✓ The duration of this program is 3 years full time study (40 units per semester) or part time equivalent.
- ✓ The maximum time to complete this program is 8 years.

## Bachelor of Social Science Major Sequences

A Major is an area of study that you wish to focus on in your program. A course will count towards your Major if it is listed as a compulsory or directed course under the relevant Major in the [handbook](#). In each Major you must complete 80 units:

1. 20 units of 1000 level courses for each Major, including all 1000 level compulsory courses in each Major.
2. 20 units of 2000 level courses for each Major, including 10 units of 2000 level Compulsory courses in each Major.
3. 40 units of 3000 level courses for each Major, including 20 units of 3000 level Compulsory courses in each Major.
