To be eligible to graduate make sure you have completed 320 units (10 units = 1 course unless otherwise specified) which meet the following criteria:

- ✓ Core courses - 310 units.
- ✓ Electives - 10 units. Visit the [Course Handbook](#) to see a list of available Electives.
- ✓ In year 4 students will enrol in either a Graded or Ungraded Honours stream. Eligibility for the Graded Honours stream will be considered by the completion of Year 3.
- ✓ The duration of the program is 4 years full time (40 units per semester).
- ✓ The maximum time to complete this program is 6 years.
- ✓ This program contains clinical/professional placements. Students must meet [NSW Health Verification Requirements](#) and obtain a WorkCover approved First Aid Certificate.
