To be eligible to graduate make sure you have completed 40 units (10 units = 1 course unless otherwise specified) which meet the following criteria:

- ✓ Core courses - 30 units.
- ✓ Directed courses - 10 units
- ✓ BIOS6910: Biostatistics A should be taken before BIOS6920: Biostatistics B
- ✓ EPID6420: Epidemiology A - Basic Methods should be taken before EPID6430: Epidemiology B - Research Designs
- ✓ If chosen as a Directed course, EPID6600: Research Protocol Design should be taken in your final term of study
- ✓ Due to course availability, students who commence in Semester 2 are not able to complete the program in one Semester
- ✓ The maximum time to complete this program is 3 years.
- ✓ The above full-time enrolment patterns comply with the conditions of international student visas. Failing to follow this enrolment advice may result in international students not being able to graduate within the period of their Confirmation of Enrolment
